#### VILLAGE VISIT REPORT II B.COM - B

#### **INTRODUCTION**

On 12.12.2019 (Tuesday) we started our bus at 9.30 am to Valmanapalayam, Kelur. We reached Kelur approximately at 10.30 am. Our aim is to interact with the people who belongs to Valmanapalayam, Kelur so that they may feel comfortable with us. We planned to enrich greenery by planting seed balls. We decided to generate awareness about the warning signs and health issues.

#### PLANTING SEED BALLS

As soon as we got down the bus, we started to walk through the paddy fields. This made us to feel how was the condition of agriculture. We divided seed balls in groups and started planting it. Seed balls, also known as "earth balls" and consists of variety of different seeds rolled within a ball of clay, preferably volcanic pyroclastic red clay. Various additives may be included, such as humus or compost.

#### **STEPS**

1) Mix the soil, clay and one part water thoroughly. There should be no lumps.

2) Add seeds.

3) Take small bits of the clay mixture and roll into ball about one inch in diameter.

- 4) Dry seed balls for 24-48 hours in a shady place before sowing or storing.
- 5) The last step in how to make flower, seed balls is sowing them.



#### AWARENESS

Then we went to school. There we met students. We communicated with them to spread awareness about health hygiene, good touch and bad touch. We were open and kind to them while teaching them good touch and bad touch. We insisted them they are the owners of their body and we conveyed that in a language which is easily approachable to them. We made the complex thoughts into simpler one so that the kids were actively listening without any hesitation. Then we explained through various examples what good and bad touch is and we educate them to say strictly "no" in discomforting situations.



#### **BIRTHDAY CELEBRATION**

We enlarged their happiness by celebrating the special occasions of the students and villagers. By doing these activities we became very close to them and they treated us one among them. After this incident they felt very happy because they never rejoiced like this before. We gathered all the peoples of the village in a place and it became the celebration of the villagers.





#### **TRAFFIC RULES**

- How To Wash Hands
- Good Touch and Bad Touch
- Hygiene and Sanitation
- Climate Change and Water Conservation
- Open Defecation

We had orientation sessions for 1<sup>st</sup>-9<sup>th</sup> Standard students. We grouped ourselves into 5 teams and talked about respective topics.



#### **Team 1: How to wash the hands**

First we went to Balvadi. There we taught the children how to wash their hands and when to wash hands.

We practically explained to them by showing how to wash the hands because children often used to play with sand and their hands will be dirty. If they took something and eat with that dirty hand the germs will affect the health of the children. So we explained about the effects of not washing the hands. Step by step he explained the procedure of washing hands. Children had interaction with us they listened to us careful. Finally we asked the children to wash their hands. The children were very interested and they too enjoyed well.



#### **Team 2: Good Touch and Bad Touch**

Good touch bad touch is a very important lesson for both boys and girls. Sexual assault has been at its peak in India and it is important for both the genders to know what is right and wrong.



We explained

- What is good touch and bad touch
- Importance of knowing about sexual violence explained in the most basic manner
- Examples of those affected

We learnt a lot from this activity and how the children received these messages. We created a lot of awareness by also presenting videos.

#### **Team 3: Sanitation and Hygiene**

Orientation to 1 to 5 students about self-Sanitation hygiene how to do hand washing? How to wash the clothes, how to maintain nail clean? How to bathe? Awareness was given by our students to the children's.

#### Hand washing

Keeping hands clean during an emergency helps prevent the spread of germs. If your tap water is not safe to use, wash your hands with soap and water that has been made safe to use. See the hand washing method below for more information on how to keep hands clean during an emergency.

How should you wash your hands?

- Wet your hands with clean, running water (warm or cold), turn off the tap, and apply soap.
- Lather your hands by rubbing them together with the soap. Be sure to lather the backs of your hands, between your fingers, and under your nails.
- Scrub your hands for at least 20 seconds. Need a timer? Hum the "Happy Birthday" song from beginning to end twice.
- **Rinse** your hands well under clean, running water.
- **Dry** your hands using a clean towel or air dry them.

#### Bathing

Bathing or showering after a water-related emergency should only be done with clean, safe water. Sometimes water that is not safe to drink can be used for bathing, but be careful not to swallow any water or get it in your eyes. Do not bathe in water that may be contaminated with sewage or toxic chemicals. This includes rivers, streams, or lakes that are contaminated by flood water.

If you have a drinking water well, listen to your local health authorities for advice on using your well water for showering bathing. If extensive flooding has occurred or you suspect that your well may be contaminated, contact your local, state, or tribal health department for specific advice on well testing and disinfection



#### **Team 4:Dental Hygiene**

Brushing your teeth after a water-related emergency should only be done with clean, safe water. Listen to local authorities to find out if tap water is safe to use.


