About 484 students from classes IX to XII Std were screened, among which 2 students with hearing loss & 25 students with speech & language disorders were identified. Counseling was given to all regarding hearing care and importance of speech & language therapy. Further detailed evaluation and recommendation were given to students who are concerned.





## World Disability Day – Free Village Screening Camp

The Department of Audiology & Speech Language Pathology, Holy Cross College (Autonomous), Tiruchirappalli conducted a camp on 03/12/17 at Dindugal village in concern to World Disability Day. The camp was conducted between 10.30a.m. to 2.30p.m. Audiological & Speech Language evaluation was done for all the people who attended the camp. The main motto of the camp was identification of hearing loss and speech and language disorders. Total of 90 individuals were screened and counseled. 25 individuals were identified with hearing loss based on the audiological screening results. 19 individuals were diagnosed as having conductive and mixed hearing loss. To rule out the conductive component they were recommended for ENT consultation and revaluation after ENT clearance. Sensorineural hearing loss was identified in 6 individuals. Clients with sensorineural hearing loss were recommended for detailed evaluation and hearing aid trail. 6 children and 5 adults were screened for speech and language problems. Among 11 clients, 10 were recommended for detailed speech and language evaluation. 1 client was counseled regarding vocal hygiene tips. All the individuals who attended the camp were counseled regarding the need for detailed evaluation and aural hygiene.





#### ST.THOMAS MERCY HOME – HEARING SCREENING CAMP

The Department of Audiology & Speech Language Pathology, Holy Cross College (Autonomous), Tiruchirappalli conducted Audiological screening camp on 16/12/17 at St. Thomas Mercy Home, Crawford, Tiruchirapalli, between 10.00 a.m. to 3.00p.m. The main motto of the camp was identification of hearing loss among old age population. Total of 55 individuals were screened and counseled. 54 individuals were identified with hearing loss based on the audiological screening results. 3 individuals were diagnosed as having conductive and 19 individuals were diagnosed as having mixed hearing loss. To rule out the conductive component they were recommended for ENT consultation and revaluation after ENT clearance. Sensorineural hearing loss was identified in 32 individuals. Clients with sensorineural hearing loss were recommended for detailed evaluation and hearing aid trail. All the individuals who attended the camp were counseled regarding the need for detailed evaluation and aural hygiene.





### Ammapettai Free Village - Screening Camp

The Department of Audiology & Speech Language Pathology, Holy Cross College (Autonomous), Tiruchirappalli conducted Audiological screening camp on 17/12/17 at Ammapettai village between 10.00a.m. to 3.00p.m. The main motto of the camp was identification of hearing loss and creating awareness among the villagers regarding hearing conservation and early identification of hearing loss. Total of 70 individuals were screened and counseled. 25 individuals were identified with hearing loss based on the audiological screening results. 19 individuals were diagnosed as having conductive and mixed hearing loss. To rule out the conductive component they were recommended for ENT consultation and revaluation after ENT clearance. Sensorineural hearing loss was identified in 6 individuals. Clients with sensorineural hearing loss were recommended for detailed evaluation and hearing aid trail. All the individuals who attended the camp were counseled regarding the need for detailed evaluation and aural hygiene.





#### MICHEALPATTI VILLAGE – HEARING SCREENING CAMP

The Department of Audiology & Speech Language Pathology, Holy Cross College (Autonomous), Tiruchirappalli conducted Audiological screening camp on 21/1/18 at Michealpatti village near Lalgudi, Tiruchirapalli, between 10.00 a.m. and 3.00p.m. The main motto of the camp was identification of hearing loss among village population. Total of 48 individuals were screened and counseled. 25 individuals were diagnosed as having minimal hearing loss, 15 individuals were diagnosed as having conductive hearing loss, 11 individuals were diagnosed as having sensorineural hearing loss, 10 individuals were diagnosed as having mixed hearing loss and 2 individuals were diagnosed as having profound hearing loss. To rule out the conductive component they were recommended for ENT consultation and revaluation after ENT clearance. Clients with sensorineural, mixed and profound hearing loss were recommended for detailed evaluation and hearing aid trail. All the individuals who attended the camp were counseled regarding the need for detailed evaluation and aural hygiene.
