Report of the Interactive Session with Prof. Brenda Beck - 1/2/2016



The PG and Research Department of English conducted an Interactive Session with Prof. Brenda Beck, Adjunct Professor, University of Toronto and President of the Sophia Hilton Foundation of Canada on 1st February, 2016 at 8 am in the Communication Lab, Department of English. Prof. Beck spoke to the audience on the invaluable folk traditions of Tamil and Kongunadu culture. She recounted her experience of researching and creating her important work The Legend of Ponnivala, an important yet sometimes forgotten Kongunadu epic narrating the Annamar Kadhai.

In her address, Prof. Beck impressed on her audience the value of the forgotten tradition of the storytellers whose contributions to the oral tradition are immense, but also now lost. She believes that the first step to this preservation rests with the 'Translation' of the old texts and songs into languages easily accessible to all. She urged the students and faculty to conduct research on Indian, especially Tamil folk traditions, so that the beauty and the importance of our cultural heritage is not lost in this globalised and Westernised world.
