

- ➤ The main objectives and goals focus on the integral and cognitive enrichment of different levels of students and to provide skill based and value added education. Value education is an integral part of the curriculum and value education classes are incorporated in the time table and are backed up by specially designed text books exclusively prepared by the faculty of the college.
- > The syllabus is upgraded periodically (every 3yrs) and new courses are introduced.
- Ph.D programmes were sanctioned to the departments of History, Economics and Visual Communication
- Review commission for M.Phil programme in 10 departments was held
- The inspection committee visit for Add on Courses in Botany, Commerce and History was held.
- Autonomy review committee visit was on 12th February 2013.
- Every academic year the revised curriculum is validated by academic audits conducted by the external subject experts and approved by the Board of Studies and Academic Council.
- The curriculum which focuses on leadership skills, communicative skills, team building and teamwork capacities is conducive for the students to get and have a holistic growth and the syllabi enable them to excel academically, and also instill social consciousness and foster overall development.
- > RESCAPES, an extension activity is integrated into the curriculum.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning

- Learning Management System is one of the effective systems that works regularly and focuses on providing effective teaching practice to the staff and higher grade learning process to the students. The system is maintained successfully working on Smart Board classes and e-content preparation. The faculty conduct classes using Smart Board and prepare their own e-content for teaching. More e-lessons were prepared during this year.
- Industrial Training, Educational Tours, Extra Credits for High Achievers, Field Trips, Internship, and Summer Placement are some of the creative teaching and learning methodologies adopted.
- > Introduction of Text Books prepared by staff members used as reference books
- The traditional system as well as modern digital equipments and modern technological aids are used to make the teaching learning more informative and effective. Assignments and seminars through ICT mode
- Final year Students are made to present papers in National/ International seminars/ Conferences as part of their learning process.
- Bridge Course was conducted in the beginning of the year for all the first year U G students to develop LSRW skills with inputs from the Language Lab and Communication Lab.
- Exhibitions, project work, models, charts, poster presentations, role play and Power Point Presentation.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation
