### Teaching

#### a) Gender Studies Course

The Centre has been offering Gender Studies Foundation Course to II UG students (Except students of Audiology & Speech Language Pathology) of the entire college as per the norms of the Bharathidasan University since 2011 with University provided syllabus and text books which are in English and Tamil. Students write two internal tests for 50 marks and external examination for 50 marks. All II UG students (1239) except School of Management Studies studied the course in the Odd semester and III UG students of School of Management Studies (505) such as Department of Commerce, Economics and Business Administration studied the course in the even Semester. A total of 1744 students benefited from the course in this academic year 2020-2021.

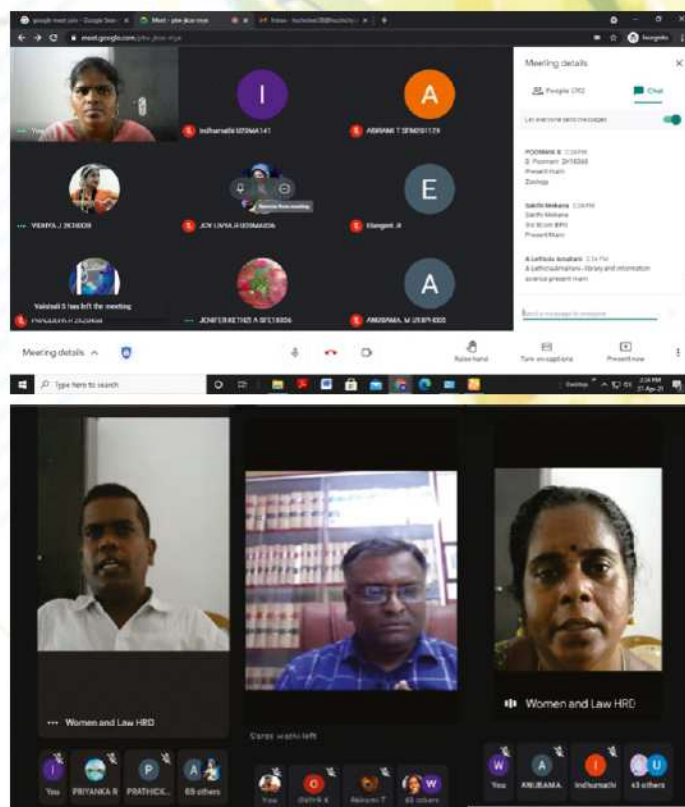
#### b) Certificate Course in Gender and Development

The examination for Bharathidasan University approved Certificate course in Gender and

Development was conducted for the students of Shift - II in the even semester. Due to COVID 19 issue, students were unable to write semester/final exam in the previous year. So they wrote their exams in the even semester and a total of 23 students qualified for the degree certificate.

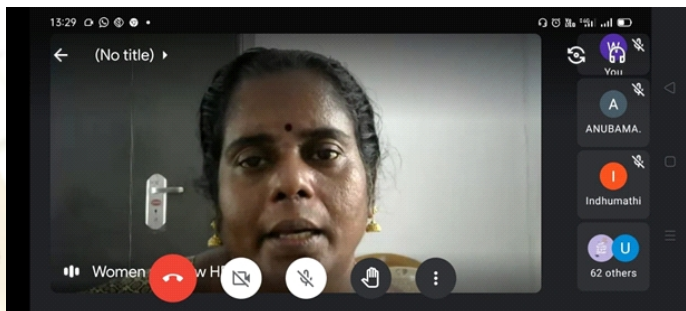
#### c) Certificate Course in Women and Law

Certificate Course in Women and Law was offered to the students through HRD offered Certificate courses from 26 April 2021 to 30 April 2021 from 9 a.m. to 2.30 p.m. The entire course was handled by Mr. M. Chinna Mani, Advocate, Ms. S. Gomathi, Advocate, Mr. S. Kothandaraman, Advocate, Tiruchirappalli and Dr. R. Saraswathi, Co-ordinator, Women's Studies Centre, HCC through online platform.



Under Graduate and Post Graduate students from various Departments and comprising of both boys and





girls studied the course. One hundred and three students registered for the Certificate Course. Ninety four students attended the entire course. The students opined that the course was very useful and met their expectations. They also suggested that the course could be conducted for the entire College students for their benefit.

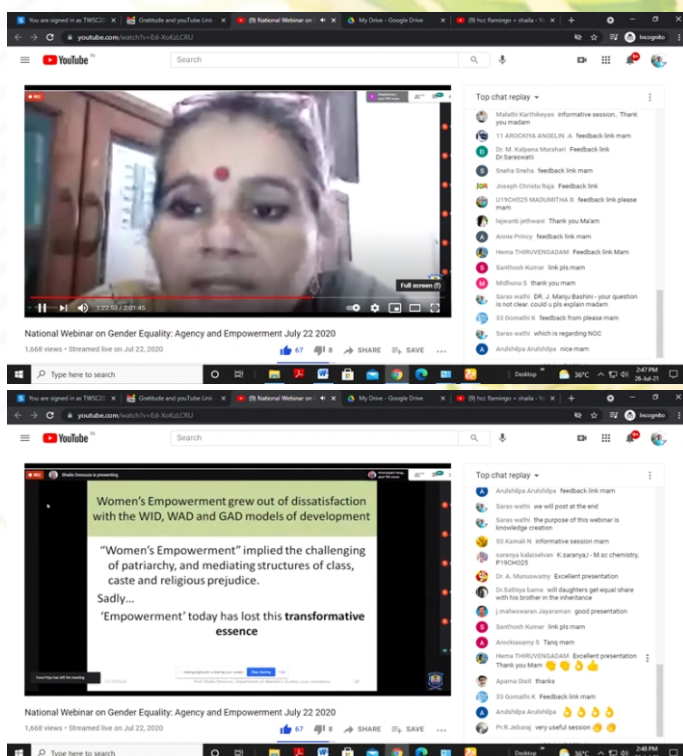

The Women's Studies Centre organized the National Webinar on Gender Equity: Agency and

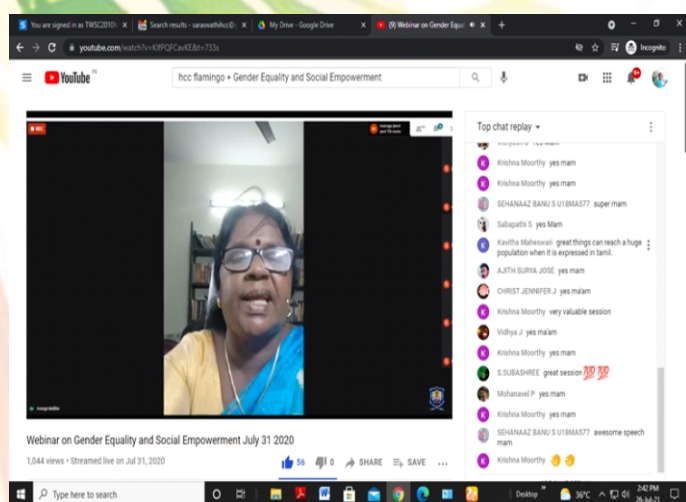

She stated that the concept of equality and social movements towards equality are not new but Gender Equality is more recent. Gender Equality is now an international buzz word. Goal 5 of the United Nation's Sustainable Development Goals for 2030 mentioned about gender equity. Equality implies treating everyone alike with the goal to promote fairness and justice. Women's Empowerment implied the challenging of patriarchy and mediating structures of class, caste and religious prejudice. Total number of beneficiaries of this conference was 1768.

### ❖ Webinar on Gender Equality and Social Empowerment (Language: Tamil)

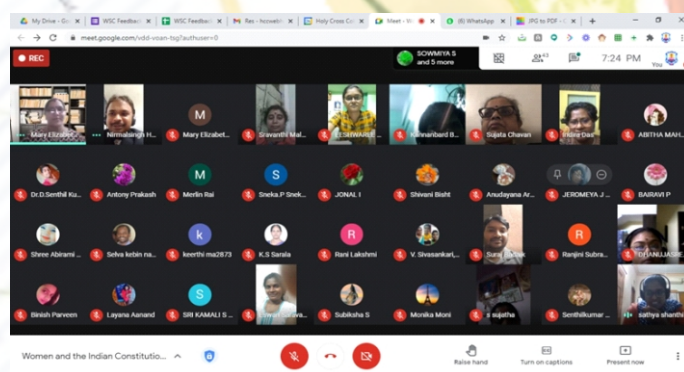
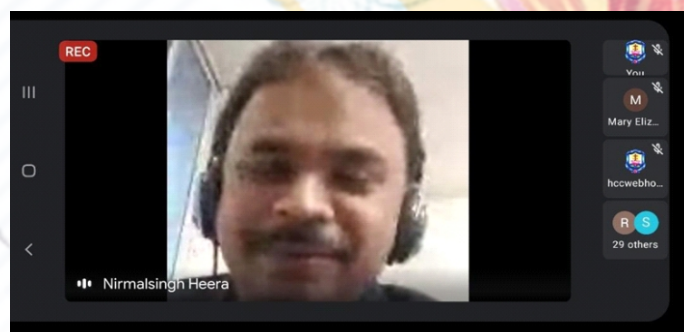

Dr.R. Mallika, Associate Professor and Head, Department of Tamil and Director, Centre for Women's Studies, Ethiraj College for Women (Autonomous), Chennai shared that Women are concentrating more on satisfying practical gender needs at home. Women's body is not a commodity. Men should have the capacity to understand Women's talent and power. United Nations says that the government should ensure that women's needs are fulfilled. During this pandemic period, women's workload has increased. She has shared lot of data on violence against women. Women's household activities should be taken into account and they should be respected. Government should take into account women's household activities. She has also requested to create a platform to increase the courage of women. 1144 persons from both College and public participated via google meet and you tube.

### ❖ Constitution Day Celebration - 'Women and the Indian Constitution - A Transitional Approach'

Mr.A. Nirmal Singh Heera, Assistant Professor (Law), Tamil Nadu National Law University, Tiruchirappalli, was the resource person for the webinar and gave a talk on 'Women and the Indian Constitution – A Transitional Approach' at Constitution Day Celebration on 26 November 2020 conducted by Women's Studies Centre, Holy Cross College, Tiruchirappalli. 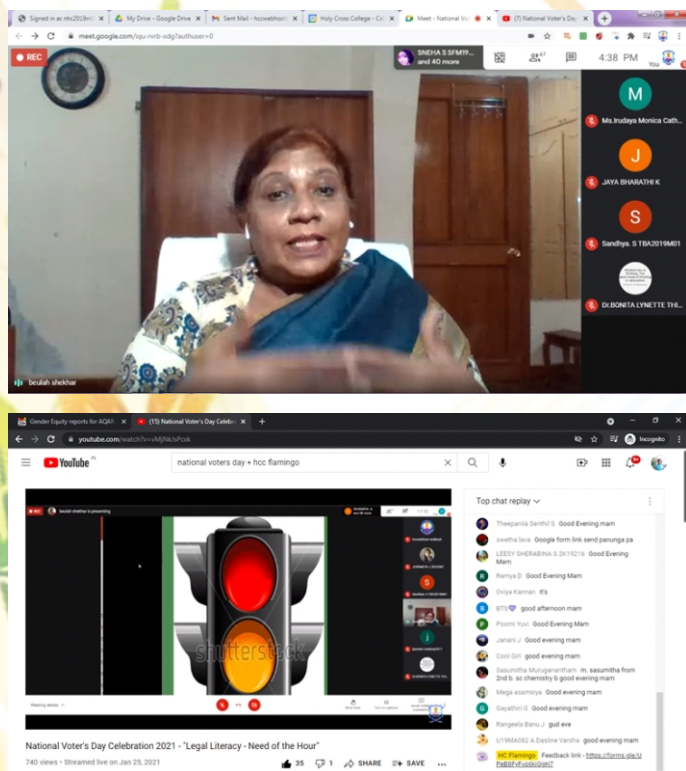

### ❖ National Voter's Day Celebration 2021 - "Legal Literacy - Need of the Hour"

Women's Studies Centre celebrated National Voter's Day on the webinar topic on 'Legal Literacy – Need of the Hour' on 25 January 2021. Dr. Beulah Shekhar, Emeritus Professor, Department of Criminology, Karunya Institute of Technology & Sciences, Coimbatore, Tamil Nadu was the resource person. Dr. Beulah Shekhar enlightened on the main purpose of the NVD celebration that is to encourage, facilitate and maximize enrolment, especially for the new voters. It also focuses on ECI's commitment

### ❖ Programme on Gender and Socialization

The Webinar held on the topic "Gender and Socialization" by Women's Studies Centre on 13 March, 2021, imparted the much needed descriptions on gender norms and gender sensitizations. The talk was delivered by Dr. N. Murugeswari, Professor, Department of Women's Studies, Bharathidasan University, Kijamalai Campus, Trichy. She began the session by bringing out the difference between gender and sex. She referred to gender as Sociological determination whereas sex as a Biological one. She mentioned that these were the







intimate causes for gender discriminations. She also made many interactions by assigning exercises and asked the students to point out the gender and sex based discriminations. She made a clear notion that a family is wholly responsible for a society's upliftment and also suggested that every family should consider the girl children equal to men and never resist manual tasks which showcase their ability. She concluded that a Gender Neutral Society will be attained if we stand by the 4 'E's, such as Education, Economic Independence, Empowering Women and Enhancing the morale and Self-Confidence. A total of 597 persons attended the webinar through google meet and youtube.

### ❖ Programme on Gender Equity

Women's Studies Centre conducted an 'Awareness Programme on Gender Equity' for students (Men) of Holy Cross College on 19 March 2021 at 1 p.m at Regina's hall, Holy Cross College, Tiruchirappalli. The resource person Mr.K.Sathish Kumar, Assistant Professor, Department of Tamil, Kalai Kavari College of Fine Arts, Tiruchirappalli explained about gender equity, gender equality, difference between rights, responsibilities, and opportunities. He informed that 90 % women were sent off from their work due to pregnancy and child

rearing practices. Gender equity is the need of the hour which promotes equal access to both women and men to material resource – land, labour and capital and intellectual resources such as education, political participation and decision making power. Gender mainstreaming should be done in almost all areas for the betterment of the society. Mr.Xavier, I MSW thanked the gathering. The programme came to an end at 2.30 p.m. There was a participation of 25 male students from the Departments of Visual Communication, Social Work, Psychology and Library and Information Science and opined that the programme was beneficial and a motivation to read Tamil literature related to gender equity.

#### ❖ Documentation of Newspaper Clippings

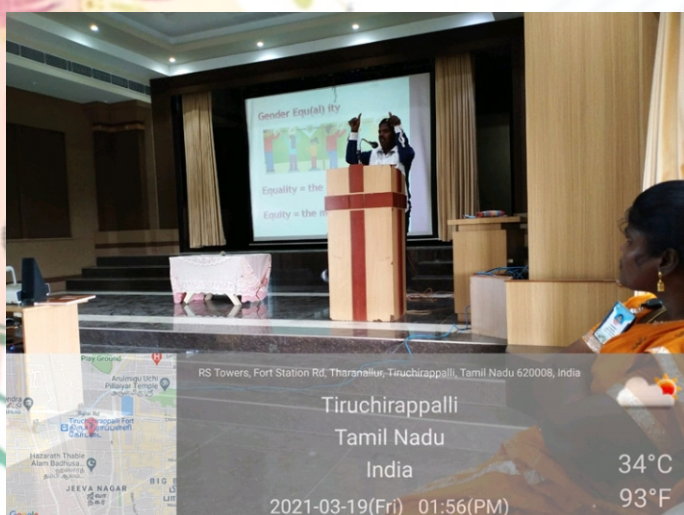
The Centre is continuously documenting newspaper clippings pertaining to women achievers, women's issues and challenges at the national and global levels.

## Advocacy

### Functioning of Legal Aid Clinic (LAC)

The Legal Aid Clinic did not have advocate's visit since the District Legal Services Authority, Tiruchirappalli did not send advocates to any clinic due to COVID-19 issue. Dr.R.Saraswathi, (Co-ordinator, WSC) the Para-Legal Volunteer was engaged in guiding people to prepare petition to find solution for their issue.

#### Case 1

Ms.A (L.A No.645/21) filed a petition for family reunion and it was forwarded to the District Legal Services Authority. At the third sitting, her husband came and the lawyer said that he could not do anything without his mother's permission, so the lawyer who tried to reconcile said that he should come with his mother. Two days later, he came with his mother. The conflict was sorted out and they united.

#### Case 2

Ms.B (L.A No.646/21) was married on 22.4.2019 and has a ten-month-old baby boy. Her Mother-in-law

created lot of problems and her drunken husband attacked her severely. so she went to her mother's house to live for sometimes and asked her husband about the problem. She wanted to live with her husband in nuclear family but her husband refuses. Her request was accepted and sent to the District Legal Services Authority. Her husband attended the conciliation session and at last both reconciled are living a happy life now.

#### Case 3

Ms.C (L.A No.338/21) the mother of an office staff at Holy Cross College approached Legal Aid Clinic to get her share from ancestral property which her bother is enjoying entirely. She is living in extreme poverty. Her petition was received and sent to the District Legal Services Authority on 7.4.2021 for first sitting. But her brother family did not come. So she was asked to come for second sitting on 23.04.2021. The case is in process at Alternative Dispute Resolution Centre.

#### Case 4

Officials from the Slum Clearance Board had given assurance that they will allot a house for Ms. D (L.A No.775/20) where she stayed. Her name had been added to the name list because the Para Legal Volunteer had gone to the construction site and the name was on the name list. Now the construction of house is over. A reminder letter has been sent by the District Legal Services Authority requesting that a house is not been allotted to her even though the houses is nearing completion. If there is no positive reply we have planned to appeal to court for justice.

#### Case 5

Ms.E sent her husband abroad for employment due to family poverty. From there he made no contact with his wife and did not send any money. She was also unable to contact him. Due to extreme poverty, she asked her mother-in-law for a share in the property. The Legal Aid Clinic advised that by filing a lawsuit she can get the property needed for the betterment of their children.

#### Case 6

One administrative staff's first daughter eloped from her house while going to College on 3 March 2021. The staff went to nearby police station with an Advocate to file a complaint to find her daughter. But the police officials did not take the petition since the girl was a major and has a right to take decision. On receiving information from the head of the institution, the LAC Co-ordinator filed an on-line petition (Reference No. RHR21034441) as per the request of Dr. M. Mary Jayanthi, Vice Principal, HCC on



6 March 2021. The Petitioner received calls from the Police station and assured that they will find her daughter. The girl was also found within a week and produced before the parent. Now she is continuing her studies after marriage.

### Legal Advice:

- ❖ Guided an administrative staff to change her date of birth and father's name instead of husband's name in the Aadhar card at Head Post Office
- ❖ One scholar was guided to file complaint in Local Police station to take her things from an Industry where she stayed and worked on part-time basis.

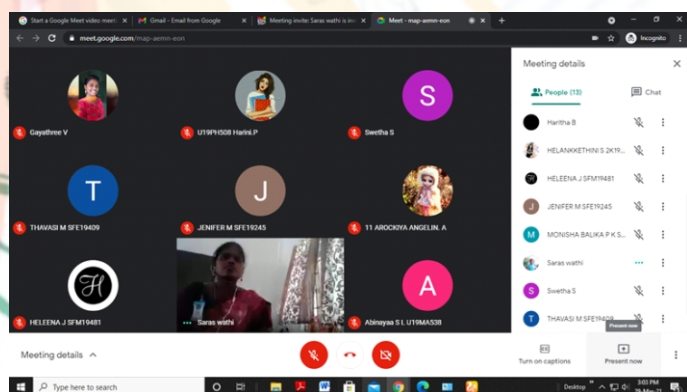
### Referral Work:

- ❖ One administrative staff's husband passed away nearly 10 years ago. She hasn't received death certificate. Since she wanted to avail widow welfare fund from government, the Co-ordinator informed her to avail receipt from cemetery then she can apply for her husband's death certificate.
- ❖ One administrative staff wanted to receive her husband's death certificate. She was informed to give the necessary documents to apply for the same.
- ❖ Referred a girl to avail government scheme for financial assistance under single girl child scheme.
- ❖ One teaching staff requested the details for a single girl child scheme. The LAC Co-ordinator referred to collect details from Collectorate
- ❖ Referred an Advocate to an Aided staff to collect her father's property case details at Nagercoil

### WSC Representatives

The meeting with WSC representatives was conducted on the basis of need. The Co-ordinator explained the background of the Centre, milestones, wings and the purpose of having the WSC.

Representatives from each Department attended the first meeting through Google meet platform on



29 March 2021 from 2.30 p.m. to 3.10 p.m. The WSC Co-ordinator also spoke about Level II: Soft Skill Development classes and also informed that we shall conduct extra classes for the absentees. WSC had 23 representatives this year.

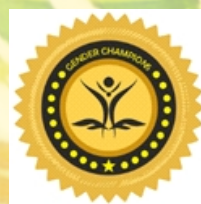

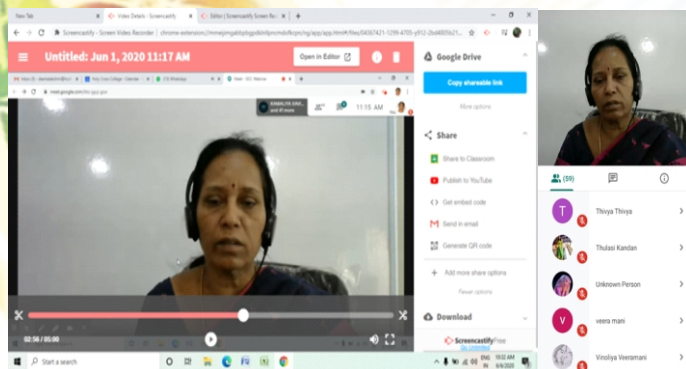

## Webinar on Gender Equality: A Prerequisite for Development

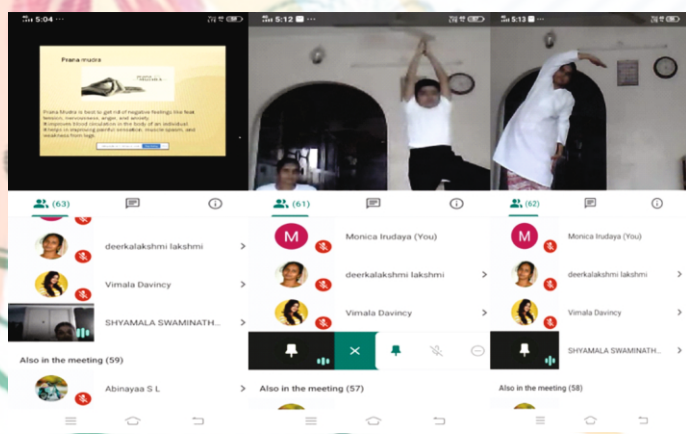

## Webinar on 'Simple Yoga for our Body and Mind'

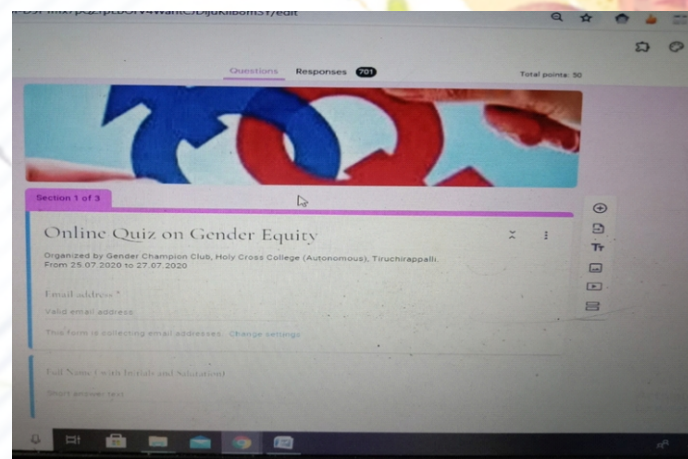

## Online Quiz on Gender Equity

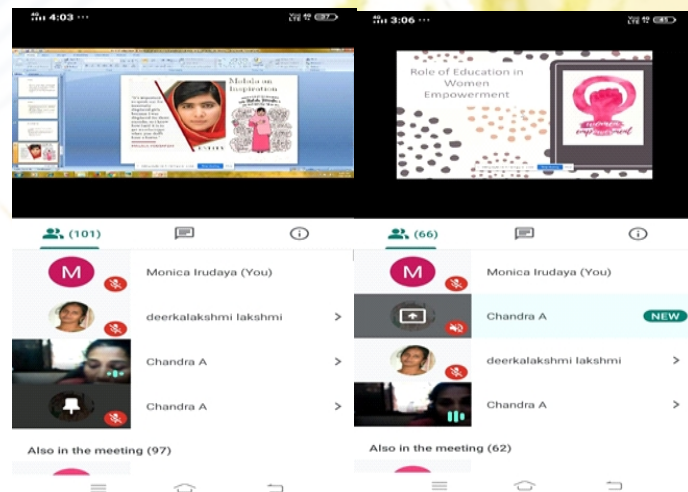

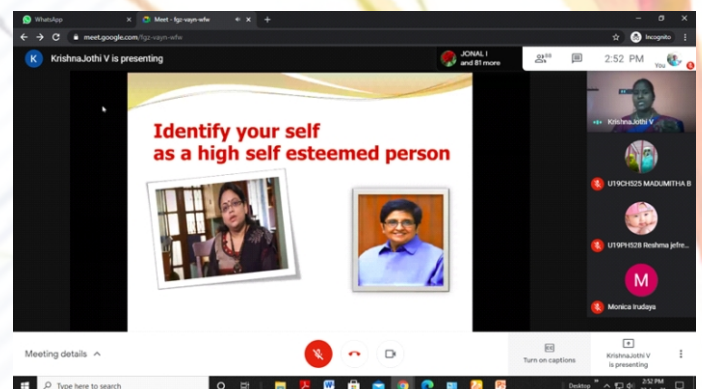

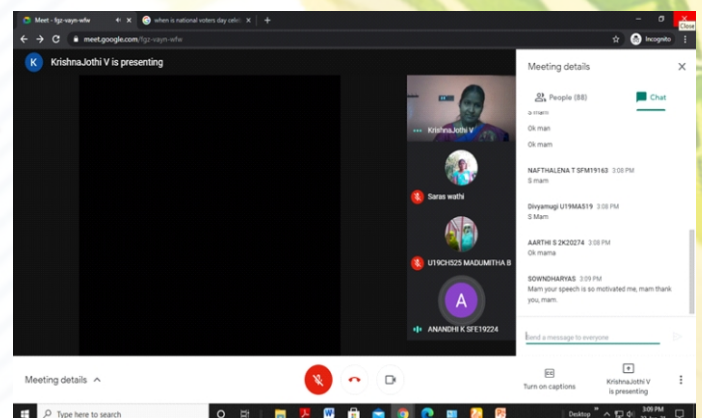
## Webinar on “National Girl Child Day 2021”

made the audience feel elated on being born as female child. She also insisted that the students should be grateful to their parents for nurturing and treating them

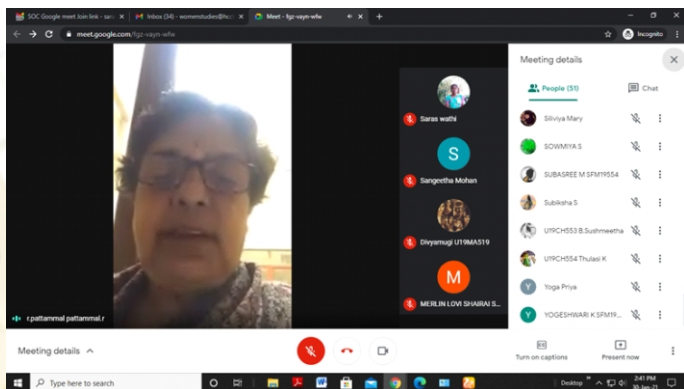


as their little princesses. 78 students participated in the webinar.

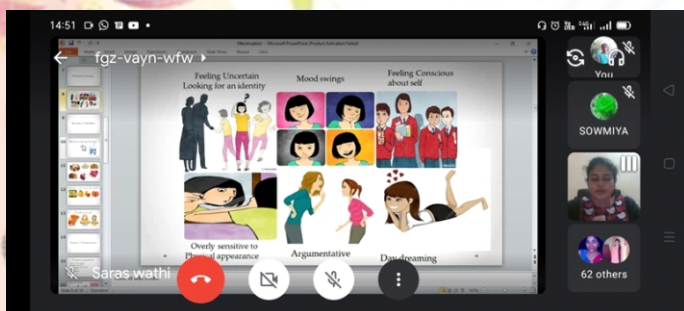
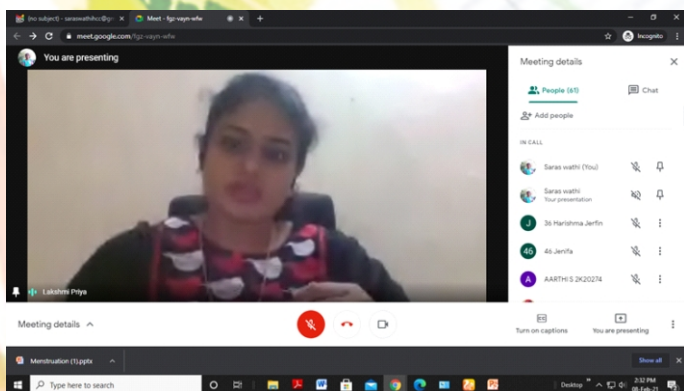




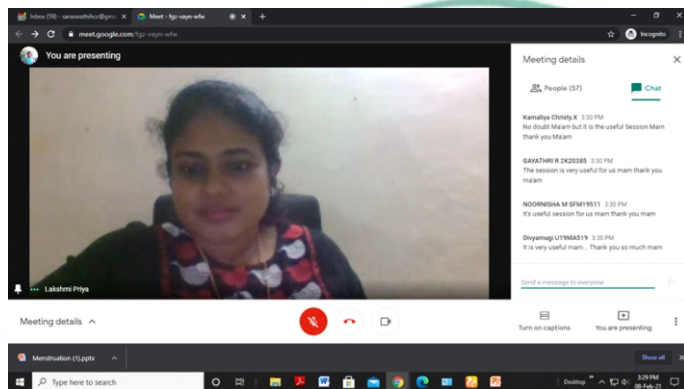
